Keshet Statement on Creating Change 2019

Following the protest at the 2019 annual LGBTQ Task Force Creating Change conference, Keshet made the following statement:

"Every year, the Creating Change conference is a site of protest. Whether the topic is police brutality, exclusion of trans women of color, or Israel-Palestine, disruptive activism is part of the culture of the conference. This is important context for understanding the action at this year's conference in which activists demanded engagement with Israel-Palestine issues at Creating Change and called for solidarity with Palestinians.

To be clear, we believe that there is no room for anti-Semitism in the LGBTQ rights movement or in any other liberation movement. While we believe that criticism of Israel is at times anti-Semitic, we do not believe that it is necessarily anti-Semitic. In the case of this year's Creating Change conference, we view blanket accusations of anti-Semitism as inflammatory and divisive. They do nothing to move forward conversations about anti-Semitism in America.

Over the past two years, we have seen a dramatic increase in acts of anti-Semitism as well as expressions of racism, Islamophobia, anti-immigrant sentiment, and homo/transphobia in the U.S. Diversity of identities and voices makes us stronger, and only together can we fight bigotry and violence in our country.
