




A letter came for you in the mail! What does it say?






### SYNAGOGUE SIGN

# JOY LADIN

Directions: read about this really cool person named Joy Ladin. Then, on the next page, answer the questions based on what you learned from the reading!

Joy Ladin is a writer and teacher who helps people understand what it means to be transgender. She was born a boy but always felt like a girl. When she grew up, Joy started living as a woman, which made her feel much happier and truer to herself.

Joy Ladin made history by becoming the first openly transgender professor at Yeshiva University, an Orthodox Jewish school. This was a big deal because Orthodox Jewish schools have very traditional ideas about gender. Even though it was hard, Joy stayed strong and kept teaching.

Joy has written many books, including poems and stories about her life. One of her famous books is called *Through the Door of Life: A Jewish Journey Between Genders*. In this book, she talks about her experience of becoming a woman and how it affected her faith and family.

Joy travels around the country giving talks about her life and why it's important to be true to who you are. She teaches people to accept and love themselves and others! Joy's work helps make the world a kinder and more understanding place.


